Randomised Chocolate Trial: How it works



STEP 1	Read the Participant Information Sheet
STEP 2	Decide whether you are eligible to take part by examining the inclusion and exclusion criteria. Ask any questions you have about the research.
STEP 3	Read and sign the Participant Consent Form.
STEP 4	Randomisation! You will be randomised to consume either white or milk chocolate
STEP 5	EAT THE CHOCOLATE!
STEP 6	Complete a short questionnaire about your chocolate eating experience

RESULTS

98 Trust staff and students on placement took part in the trial

66% of staff felt that after eating the chocolate their wellbeing either greatly or slightly improved

68% of staff felt that after taking part in the randomised chocolate trial their understanding of clinical trials either greatly or slightly increased
